Tassach was a close friend of Patrick and, as bishop of Raholp, near Saul, attended Patrick on his deathbed. Tradition ascribes to him the skills of a brass-worker and coppersmith.

**It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

It is indeed right and good,  
our duty and salvation,  
always and everywhere to give you thanks,  
holy Father, almighty and eternal God,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Today we honour Tassach,  
who in your loving providence  
enabled your Church to grow in spirit as the body of Christ.  
To your children he faithfully proclaimed  
the good news of salvation  
and nourished them by ministering your sacraments.  
Through a pastor's love  
he led your people to share your grace  
and witness to the world  
in the communion of one true faith  
and in the work of selfless charity.

On this his feast, we join with him to praise you  
and in the company of angels and all the host of heaven  
we sing for ever of your glory:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

Merciful Father, we thank you  
for these gifts of your creation,  
this bread and this wine,  
and we pray that we who eat and drink them  
in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit  
in obedience to our Saviour Christ  
in remembrance of his death and passion  
may be partakers of his body and his blood,

who on the night he was betrayed took bread;  
and when he had given you thanks  
he broke it, and gave it to his Disciples, saying,  
Take, eat. This is my body which is given for you;  
Do this in remembrance of me.

After supper, he took the cup,  
and again giving you thanks  
he gave it to his Disciples, saying,  
Drink from this, all of you,  
This is my blood of the new covenant  
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.  
Do this, as often as you drink it,  
in remembrance of me.

Father, with this bread and this cup,  
we do as our Saviour has commanded:  
we celebrate the redemption he has won for us;  
we proclaim his perfect sacrifice,  
made once for all upon the cross,  
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;  
and we look for his coming  
to fulfil all things according to your will.

**Christ has died;**

**Christ is risen;**

**Christ will come again.**

Renew us by your Holy Spirit  
unite us in the body of your Son,  
and bring us with all your people  
into the joy of your eternal kingdom;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord,  
with whom and in whom,  
by the power of the Holy Spirit,  
we worship you, Father almighty,  
in songs of never-ending praise:  
**Blessing and honour and glory and power  
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**
